VISITING STUDENT PROGRAMME

Students from other universities in any discipline, as well as in China Studies, are welcome to come and spend a semester or year of China Study at XJTLU in the Department.

Students in the Visiting Student Programme credit their XJTLU China Studies study back to their home university degree programme, though those who enroll for a year of study at XJTLU will also be eligible to receive the XJTLU Diploma of China Studies.

Students enrolling for the Visiting Students Programme typically take four modules in each semester, at the direction of their home university, of which at least one will be a Chinese language module, and three will be China Studies. The eight modules over the academic year lead to the XJTLU Diploma in China Studies, awarded at the successful completion of the study year.

A typical (and general) year of undergraduate study might be selected from the following modules:

- Chinese History
- Chinese Civilisation
- Twentieth Century China
- Doing Business in China
- China: Society and Development
- Introduction to Chinese Literature
- China: Government and Politics
- Communications in China
- Chinese Language

More specialist modules are available for students interested in China's international relations, economic development, society and politics, culture and communications.

Chinese language modules are open to all students as part of the Visiting Students Program. Students take modules suited to their level of Chinese language ability, ranging from complete beginners to advanced learners.

Teaching at XJTLU is in English.

HOW TO APPLY

Students at universities anywhere in the world may, with the permission of their home university, enrol for a semester or a year of China Studies at Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University in Suzhou.

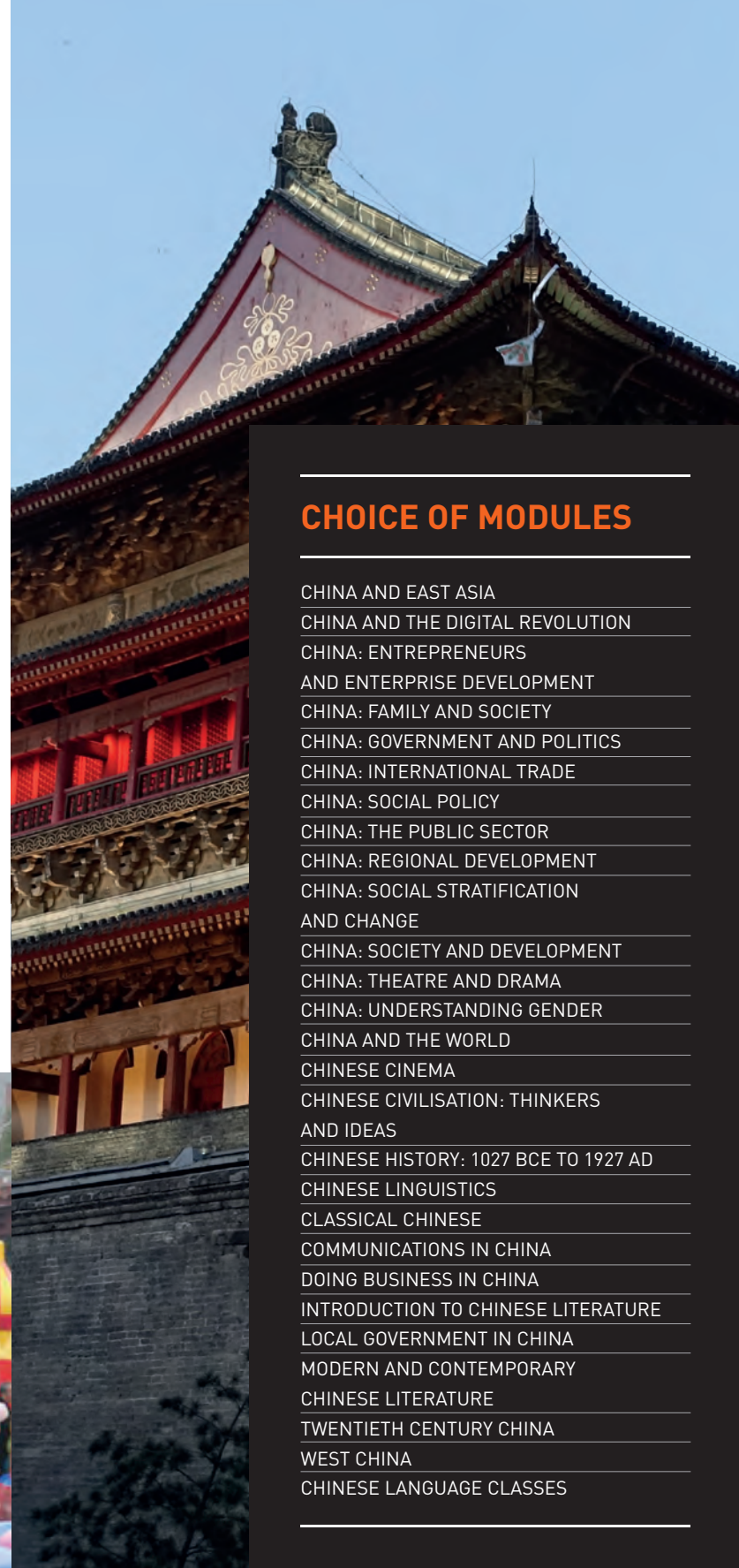

The Department teaches and researches about China's history and culture, society and politics, business and the economy. It delivers a BA in China Studies, a Visiting Student Programme, and a travelling Summer School. The Visiting Student Programme has access to all the modules taught in the BA in China Studies.

XJTLU's location in Suzhou creates a live learning laboratory to examine both China's ancient, deep-rooted history and the fast-paced contemporary society of today's China. Suzhou has long been a major centre for painting and poetry, as well as for silk production. Famous for its canals and gardens, in the contemporary era it has become equally as famous for its light industrial production which has made it one of the richest cities in the whole country.

The department's programmes are open to both Chinese and international students.
