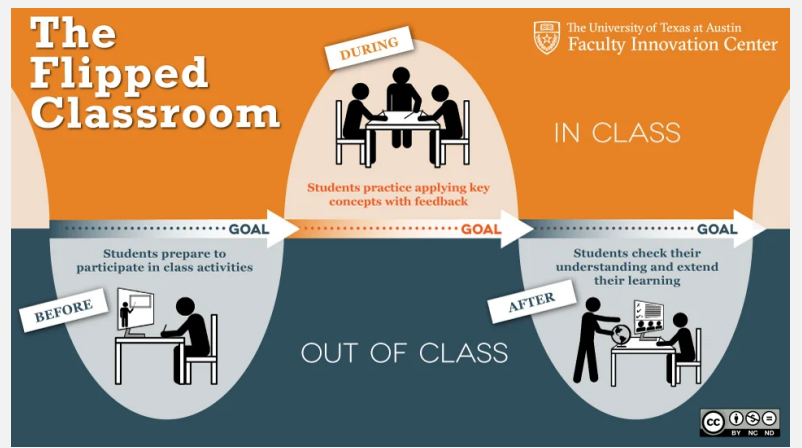


5 steps to implement Flipped Learning

1

Identify learning outcomes

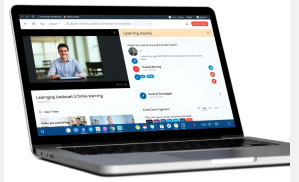
What should students achieve? Decide what they should know or do after the session.



2

Select pre-class materials

Provide readings/videos *before* class. Auto-corrected activities in the Learning Mall will help them practice the content.



3

Design active learning activities for in-class delivery

Use class time for discussion, problem-solving and/or case-based activities that apply the pre-learned material.



4

Integrate feedback and reflection

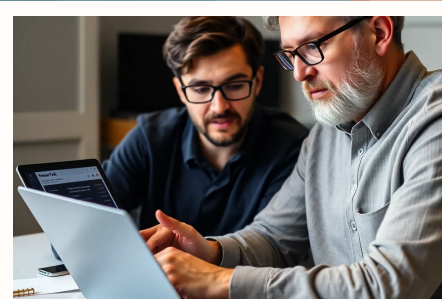
Use polls, quizzes and reflections to check understanding and adjust your teaching.



5

Evaluate and refine your approach

Collect student feedback, review outcomes and make adjustments to improve future iterations.
